NEW YORK, Sept. 12: In a horror sequence of destruction, terrorists hijacked two airlines and crashed them into the World Trade Center in a coordinated series of attacks on September 11 that brought down towers.

All flights were grounded at Lindberg Field as the nation's airline was shut down in the wake of what appeared to be coordinated terrorist attacks in New York and Washington. Security was heightened at government and military facilities around the country, and some downtown office buildings were evacuated.

1. Name of the newspaper

2. Section

3. Headline

It sums up the story or article. It's usually in a larger font and often in bold.

4. Drophead

It's a secondary headline that provides additional information about the story.

5. Byline

It's the author of the article. It appears at the beginning of the article.

6. Dateline

It has two elements: the name of the place from where a story originated and the date on which it was written. It usually appears in bold letters.

7. Lead

It briefly gives the most important information.

8. Body

It supplies additional information. It's divided into small paragraphs.

9. Photo

They are used to make a text easier to understand or more interesting.

10. Caption

It used to describe a photograph. It is known as cutline in the US.
